

Choctaws in the War of 1812

In 1811 Tecumseh of the Shawnee tried to persuade the Choctaw in joining a Pro-British coalition of Native Americans. Tecumseh addressed the Choctaw and warned them that many Native American tribes have disappeared since the arrival of the Europeans. Pushmataha re-buffed Tecumseh's rhetoric and urged his tribe from joining the Shawnee inspired movement. Pushmataha eloquently reminded the Choctaw that "these white Americans ... give us fair exchange, their cloth, their guns, their tools, implements and other things which the Choctaw need but do not make ... it will be seen that the whites and Indians in this section are living on friendly and mutually beneficial terms." [Whicker, pg. 321] And so the Choctaw would again side with the United States as they did during the American Revolution. Pushmataha and several Choctaw warriors volunteered for the "Second War for Independence" from Britain starting in 1812. Their names\* are listed below [Ferguson].

\* Choctaw names are **NOT** consistently spelled the same across various documents and treaties. For example, Pushmataha can alternately be spelt as Pooshamataha or Pushmattahaw.
